

5. In these Bye-Laws “Premises” means any houses, huts, sheds, structures or roofed enclosures, whether used for the purpose of human habitation or otherwise.

**“In Exercise of the Powers Conferred Upon the Atwima Kwanwoma Assembly by Section 79 of the Local Government Act of 1993 (Act 462) these Bye-Laws are Hereby Made”**

**SECTION 36: (CONTROL OF FOOD WRAPPERS) BYE-LAWS 2015**

**Commercial**

1. No vendor shall wrap cooked food in anything other than the Food Wrappers as defined in Section 3 of these Bye-Laws.

**Interpretation**

2. In these Bye-Laws “Food Wrappers” means a newsprint or polythene of non-poisonous material specially prepared for wrapping food approved by the Ghana Standards Board.

**Penalty**

3. Any vendor who contravenes these Bye-Laws, shall be guilty of an offence and shall on conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding 50 Penalty units payable to the Assembly or in default to a term of imprisonment not exceeding six (6) months and in the case of continuing the offence, a fine not exceeding **Ten Ghana Cedis (GH¢10.00)** for each day on which offence is continued.
