

PHARMACY AND DRUGS (AMENDMENT) REGULATION, 1961 (LI 156).

IN exercise of the powers conferred on the Minister responsible for Health by section 59 of the Pharmacy and Drugs Act, 1961 (Act 64) this Regulation is made this 1st day of November, 1961.

The Pharmacy and Drugs Regulations, 1961 (L.I. 142) are hereby amended as follows:—

(a) by the insertion, immediately after regulation 16, of the following new regulations—

16A. "Control of the Supply of Class A or B Drug.

The supply of a Class A or B drug to the same person or on any one prescription shall not exceed twenty-five grammes.

This provision shall not apply where a Class A or B drug is supplied upon a written order signed by a medical practitioner, dentist, veterinary surgeon or a registered pharmacist.

16B. "Emergency Supply of Class A or B Drug.

Notwithstanding the provisions of the Act, the Chairman of the Board may, by reason of an outbreak of any disease or epidemic in any place or area or where there is no medical practitioner normally resident in such place or area, issue a special permit on conditions to be specified therein to an officer in the Public Service to dispense Class A or B drugs specified in the said permit."

(b) in the Second Schedule, in the part dealing with labelling,—

(i) by the insertion, at the end of paragraph 1, of the following:—

"The provisions of sub-paragraph (3) of this paragraph shall not apply to Class C drugs."

(ii) by the deletion of paragraph 4.
